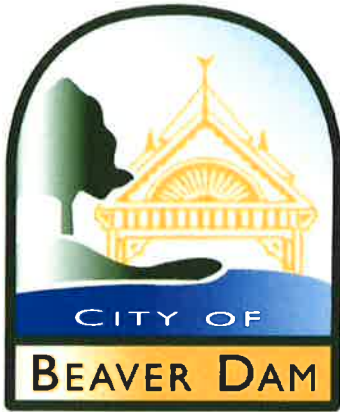

Re: Proposed Candidate and Compensation Package for Public Works Supervisor Position

The Public Works Supervisor Selection Committee proposes the hiring of Danny Mulhern for the position of Public Works Supervisor. Mr. Mulhern has an extensive background in public works as shown on the attached resume. The Mayor and I also spoke with the references supplied by Mr. Mulhern and all of them had positive things to say about him and feel confident that he will be successful in this position.

The Selection Committee proposes the following compensation package for Danny Mulhern, the recommended candidate for the Public Works Supervisor position:

Beginning annual salary shall be \$67,500. Upon satisfactory completion of a six month performance review the annual salary shall be increased to \$70,000. Both the starting and six month wage rates shall be adjusted for any wage adjustment granted to non-public safety employees through the budget process. Subsequent wage adjustment will be done in accordance with City policy.

Three weeks of vacation during the first year of year of employment. Additional vacation will be granted in accordance with City Personnel Policies. Mr. Mulhern has a planned vacation from May 24th to June 1st.

All other compensation and benefits will be granted in accordance with City policy.
