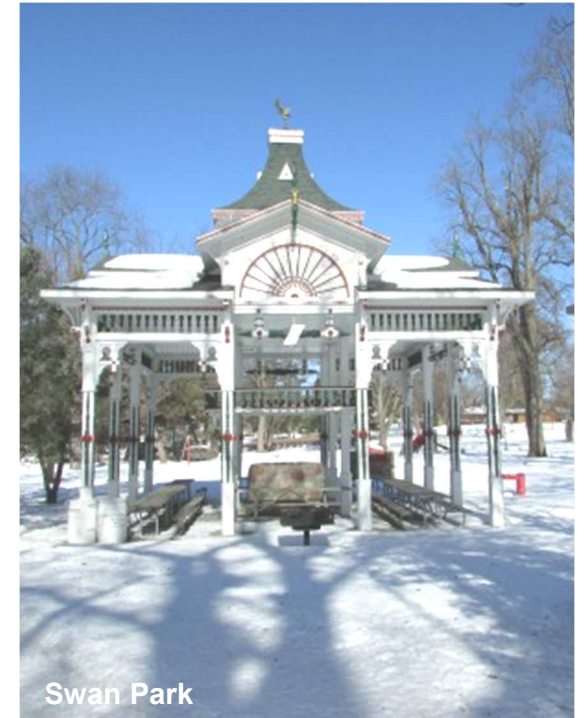

Adopt-a-Park Program Information

Adopt-A-Park is a City of Beaver Dam volunteer program coordinated by the Beaver Dam Friends of the Parks, providing opportunities for families, neighborhoods, civic clubs, youth groups, businesses, other organizations and individuals to assist in the care and maintenance of City parks, playgrounds and open space areas, resulting in **“Making Life Better”** in our community.

How Can We Help?

- Projects may include litter removal, weed control, painting, cleaning, graffiti removal, mulching, planting and playground maintenance or other special projects as approved by City staff.
- We ask that sponsorships commit for 1 year to provide 1 to 4 service projects per year, approximately 3 hours each project.
- Volunteers must be 18 years of age or older or be accompanied by an adult supervisor.
- Designate a group leader to coordinate service projects.
- Bring extra gloves, rakes, wheelbarrows, paint brushes and other equipment you may have available to help facilitate the safe and efficient completion of your particular project.

Work Safely

- Each volunteer must read and sign the Safety Guideline and Waiver before each cleanup.
- Dress appropriately for the weather and work you will be performing.
- Work only during daylight hours and only in favorable weather.
- Always use good judgment and do NOT pick up materials you suspect might be hazardous or unsafe.
- Take breaks and always have plenty of water on hand.
- Avoid working alone. Work in groups and use the buddy system.
