FIREWORKS DISPLAY AND STORAGE

WISCONSIN STATE STATUTE Chapter 167 and NFPA 1123 and 1124 shall be complied with in the display and storage of fireworks.

The operator, supplier, or sponsor shall obtain a display permit from the Fire Department prior to performing the fireworks display.

The operator shall be at least 21 years old and licensed or approved by the Fire Department in accordance with any and all applicable laws. All assistants shall be at least 18 years old.

Smoking is not allowed where fireworks are stored or handled. No smoking signs shall be posted. No smoking allowed within 50 feet.

Fire extinguishers that are approved by the Fire Department shall be located near the area where the fireworks are set up.

The operator shall have primary responsibility for safety. While the operator shall be permitted to participate actively in the firing of the fireworks display, safety shall be the primary concern of the operator.

Wherever, in the opinion of the authority having jurisdiction, or the operators, any hazardous condition exists, the fireworks display shall be postponed until the condition is corrected, i.e. bad weather, high winds, lack of crowd control, debris falling into the crowd.

In the event of a condition arising requiring the entry of emergency personnel into the fallout area, or security perimeter, the display shall be halted until the situation is resolved.

During the period before the display, where pyrotechnic materials are present, unescorted public access to the site shall not be permitted. No unauthorized persons within 50 feet.

No person shall be allowed in the discharge area while under the influence of alcohol, narcotics, or medication that could adversely affect the judgment, mobility or stability of that person.

Spectators, unauthorized vehicles, watercraft, or readily combustible materials shall not be located within the fallout area during the display.

Ground display pieces shall be located a minimum distance of 75 feet from spectators viewing areas and parking areas.

Unauthorized tents shall not be located within the display site. (A tent permit is needed from the Fire Department.)

No spectators or spectator parking shall be located within the display site.

Dry grass or combustible materials located beneath the ground display pieces shall be wet down before the display.
