The rapidly rising number of active COVID-19 cases in Dodge County has caused Beaver Dam Mayor, Becky Glewen to reevaluate walk-in counter services at City Hall, Municipal Services, the Watermark – Community Center and Library. Following completion of the November 3, 2020 election, all municipal buildings will be closed to walk-in services beginning Wednesday, November 4, 2020 through November 28, 2020.

Limiting opportunity for transmission is a proven strategy that can play a critical role in slowing an outbreak of COVID-19 and continuance of delivery of City services. The main reasons for taking this action include:

- The volume of active cases in Dodge County continues to rise; therefore there is a greater likelihood that City employees will be exposed to the COVID virus. Illness and quarantines could impair the City's ability to provide some services and carry out some functions.
- We wish to protect the public from the high rate of COVID spread and ultimately reduce the rate of spread.

Most walk-in type services can be delivered by telephone, email, or, if necessary, by appointment. We ask people to consider visiting our website, sending in payments or calling the appropriate office, rather than visiting in person. The objective is to limit the opportunity for disease transmission as much as possible.
